be to stop at Midway Island to rest, obtain fresh water, and if possible, purchase diesel fuel while sailing between Apia, Samoa and Seattle, Washington.

sail the 40 foot sailboat, Noomi, from Apia to Midway, spend a few days there, and continue on to Seattle.

c.) This activity would help the Monument by ...
allowing me to visit this fragile ecosystem, witness the effects of marine trash on pelagic birds, and encourage other yachtsmen to "leave a clean wake".

Other information or background: I am an environmentalist. I have conducted research via sailboat in the Galapagos Islands.

To obtain fresh water.

7. Answer the Findings below by providing information that you believe will assist the Co-Trustees in determining how your proposed activities are compatible with the conservation and management of the natural, historic, and cultural resources of the Monument:

The Findings are as follows:

a. How can the activity be conducted with adequate safeguards for the cultural, natural and historic resources and ecological integrity of the Monument?

I intend to visit on Midway Atoll itself. I will anchor in only one location where specified and I will use a holding tank while in the atoll and keep all trash on board the boat.

b. How will the activity be conducted in a manner compatible with the management direction of this proclamation, considering the extent to which the conduct of the activity may diminish or

enhance Monument cultural, natural and historic resources, qualities, and ecological integrity, any indirect, secondary, or cumulative effects of the activity, and the duration of such effects?
In the long run, because of my connections with the yachting community, my visit will lead to greater public awareness of the biological uniqueness and fragility of Midway.

c. Is there a practicable alternative to conducting the activity within the Monument? If not, explain why your activities must be conducted in the Monument.

I need to sail from Apia back to Seattle. Because of weather patterns, a route passing close to Midway is the most favorable. I will need to stop for water.

d. How does the end value of the activity outweigh its adverse impacts on Monument cultural, natural and historic resources, qualities, and ecological integrity?

My visit will produce no adverse impact.

e. Explain how the duration of the activity is no longer than necessary to achieve its stated purpose.

My intention is only to obtain water. I will be eager to leave as soon as possible to avoid storms in the North Pacific as I approach Seattle in August.

f. Provide information demonstrating that you are qualified to conduct and complete the activity and mitigate any potential impacts resulting from its conduct.

I am an experienced sailor with considerable experience in unique and fragile ecosystems including the Galapagos Islands to which I led a research expedition when I was a young man.

g. Provide information demonstrating that you have adequate financial resources available to conduct and complete the activity and mitigate any potential impacts resulting from its conduct.

My proposal involves no new expense for me.

h. Explain how your methods and procedures are appropriate to achieve the proposed activity's goals in relation to their impacts to Monument cultural, natural and historic resources, qualities, and ecological integrity.

My visit would have no impact.

i. Has your vessel has been outfitted with a mobile transceiver unit approved by OLE and complies with the requirements of Presidential Proclamation 8031?

No. However, I expect to have a functioning Inmarsat system, and be able to communicate via e-mail while at sea.

j. Demonstrate that there are no other factors that would make the issuance of a permit for the activity inappropriate.

There are no other factors.

The only resource I will extract is fresh water.
